

## How to Prepare for Skin Surgery at LRCP

On \_\_\_\_\_ at \_\_\_\_\_ a.m. / p.m., you will have surgery to your skin at the London Regional Cancer Program (LRCP). Please report to Radiation Therapy Reception on Level 1, 30 minutes before your appointment.

This is an outpatient procedure. A local anesthetic will be used to freeze the area so that you do not feel pain.

### Are you taking blood thinners?

If you are taking blood thinners like **ASA**, **Coumadin** or **Warfarin**, please tell a member of the Skin Clinic Team. You may need to stop them for a brief period of time before the surgery.

### How do I prepare for surgery?

- Eat and drink as usual.
- Take your medicines as prescribed, unless you are told not to.
- If the skin being treated is in the upper body or on the face, please wear a front closing shirt (e.g., button-up , zipper, etc.).
- If the skin being treated is on the leg, please have crutches or bring a wheelchair with you. You will **not** be able to put weight on the leg being treated until the stitches are removed.
