New Injury Prevention Educator

Jane Harrington began a new position as a part-time Injury Prevention Educator in the Trauma Program on April 30th - this is a newly created contract position that was made possible with the support of the Children's Health Foundation.

IMPACT HITS THE ROAD



Historically, a small group of students from each secondary school are invited to attend the **IMPACT program** at the hospital, but recently the police and secondary school teachers came up with an idea to increase **IMPACT's** reach to this vulnerable audience. They felt that more students needed to hear the important message of preventable trauma.

IMPACT's goal is to reduce drinking and driving among teenagers and to heighten their awareness to the potential consequences of high-risk behaviour. In order to increase the number of **IMPACT** presentations delivered at Secondary Schools and reach more students, more trained presenters were required.

A group of dedicated volunteers responded to a request for assistance, and agreed to enhance their presentation skills as well as increasing their knowledge and expertise in the field of injury prevention.

IMPACT VOLUNTEER AWARDS

IMPACT relies heavily on volunteerism for its sustainability, and for this reason, the program continues to acknowledge its volunteers with achievement awards.

OPP Constable Glen Childerley of the Sebringville detachment, Bobbi Waal of LHSC Victoria Emergency Department and Myron Steinmann of LHSC Respiratory Therapy were all presented with awards for their dedication and volunteerism to IMPACT.

Glen was instrumental in coordinating a new peripheral IMPACT program in Perth County that continues to thrive today.

Bobbi has been a valued volunteer with IMPACT for many years and dedicates her time presenting IMPACT at the secondary schools that focuses on the medical consequences of high-risk behaviour. Because of Bobbie and other dedicated volunteers, **our program now reaches over 300% more students!**
