

LRCP Small Grants Competiton

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q.** If figures and or tables are to be included, do they have to be included in the 6 pages of the Research Proposal?
- A.** Yes, please incorporate your figures and or tables within the 6 double spaced pages of your Research Proposal.
- Q.** I'm putting in a new research grant and will have a summer student included in the budget. Do I still need to include a one page summary of their project? Wouldn't it be redundant because I'll have that in the 6 page proposal?
- A.** If you are applying for a grant that is *not* a 'Studentship' then *no*, you do not need to include the specifics on what the student will be doing within the summary. It will be covered in the proposal. If you are applying for a 'Studentship' grant then yes, you would include the summary of work being done by the student.
- Q.** Regarding the list of grants: Do I include only the grants I currently hold or also the ones pending that I have recently applied to?
- A.** You should include both the grants you hold and also the ones applied for.
- Q.** Is there a page restriction on references?
- A.** No, there is no page restriction on references provided.
- Q.** Do the certificates for biohazards, human ethics and animal ethics need to be submitted with the grant or just supplied if successful and prior to funds being released?
- A.** The biohazard, human ethics and animal ethics certificates do not need to be submitted with your application but yes, they will be required should your grant be funded and you should have already applied for them when you submit your application. Make sure to check off which certificates you have applied for, on the second page of your application.
- Q.** I currently hold an LRCP Small Grant from the last competition. Can I apply for a different project in this round?
- A.** Yes, you may apply with a different application in this round even if you currently hold an LRCP Small Grant but you must include copies of your Progress Report with your new application.
- Q.** Can I be the principal investigator on more than one application in the same competiton?
- A.** No, you can only be the *primary applicant* (P.I.) for one project per competition; however you can be a *co-applicant* on more than one grant application in a given round.
