	from April 1.3 Guest Speakers:	 Steve Young and Saul Galindo: From communications department at LHSC. Steve and Saul are new within the last year within communications, and we fall within their portfolio. Communications is here to help support communications from PFAC to LHSC staff/Leadership, social media posts, and our PFAC website. 2.0	Items: 2.1 World Lupus day! May 10 th	 Lupus is a chronic auto immune disease that can damage any part of the body (skin, joints, organs, ect.). In lupus, something goes wrong with your immune system, which is the part of the body that fights off viruses, bacteria, and germs ("foreign invaders," like the flu). Normally our immune system produces proteins called antibodies that protect the body from these invaders. Autoimmune means your immune system cannot tell the difference between these foreign invaders and your body's healthy tissues ("auto" means "self") and creates 	

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	 autoantibodies that attack and destroy healthy tissue. These autoantibodies cause inflammation, pain, and damage in various parts of the body. May 10th is World Lupus Day, with the purpose of raising awareness and research funding for further advancements towards finding a cure. April: As someone who suffers from Lupus, it is a disease that can go undiagnosed for extended periods of time, leading to more and more complications. 50% of Lupus patients will experience Nephritis, possibly requiring some renal intervention. Raising greater awareness is crucial to moving towards a cure!

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4.0	4.1 Indigenous Engagement Update	 Terri to meet with LRCP to help better understand what are the needs of our local indigenous community, to help better implement indigenous supports within the Renal Program. Kathleen provided the name of a local contact that is doing similar work within the community. Kathleen is willing to connect with Terri to aid in assistance. 	
	4.2 Renal Exec.	 Follow up on "Should we consider a patient's financial state for transportation when looking at the listing for transition to satellite location: Ethics came back, and agreed its importance, but acknowledged the challenges with inputting a criteria for placement that encompasses something as individual ad fluid as financial state. Review being done looking at overall picture and how implement better referral process to satellite and managing growth and attrition. Staffing is still an issue at satellite locations, preventing expedited expansion of the program. PD assistance has launched at Maitland Manor for resident care. Training/funding coming into place for expansion of PD trained staff in this LTC. Proposal submitted to ORN to create a 2-station training program in Owen Sound for Home Hemo with an LHSC nurse. ICHD patient volume is growing. HH and PD modalities have seen a decrease in volume. ICHD units have been managing with moving some patient around to facilitate numbers. Ned to push for home modalities to elevate the pressure on ICHD units and improve overall home numbers. Deb suggestion: bringing back the education classes around Home modalities and bringing back the patient story telling that used to take place during these classes. Terri is working with IPAC to reinstate the in-person patient conversations with 	

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		 existing dialysis patients to help in the decision-making period of modality planning. Accreditation is set to be next April. A new contract is being put in place for fistula needles. Training being put in place for ICHD units within LHSC, will then branch out to satellites. Jane Ridley, Nurse Practitioner in the UH dialysis unit, received the "Strength in the Storm Award" today during nursing recognition.
