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Children's Hospital offers tips on how to stay out of the Emergency Department this summer

(London, Ontario) - With school out for the summer, Children's Hospital at London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC) is reminding parents and caregivers that trips to the hospital can be avoided, especially as pressures in the Emergency Department(ED) persist.

"The ED is currently experiencing high volumes, which is causing longer than normal wait times," said Dr. Rod Lim, Director of Paediatric Emergency Care at LHSC. "With summer vacation here, and kids being outside and more active, we recognize there is potential for increased injury. As much as possible, we want everyone to have a safe summer and avoid any unwanted trips to the ED."

Here are the top five current reasons for ED visits at Children's Hospital:

- 1. Injuries to the head
- 2. General infection concerns
- 3. Acute upper respiratory infections
- 4. Injuries to the elbow/forearm
- 5. Digestive/Abdomen

"There are some measures parents and caregivers can take to prevent common injuries from happening, including wearing a helmet while riding a bike, scooter or skateboard," added Dr. Lim. "Also, personal flotation devices are a lifesaver for children when they are in and around water and, last but not least, stay hydrated this summer, especially during really hot days."

LHSC staff are here 24 hours a day to help and appreciate the community's patience as we continue to address ED pressures.
