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COVID-19 Assessment Centre expands services to ease Emergency Department pressures

(London, Ontario) - The COVID-19 Assessment Centre at London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC), in collaboration with the Middlesex London Ontario Health Team, has expanded services and transitioned to the 'COVID, Cold and Flu Care Clinic' (CCFCC) as of today, December 9, 2022, to ease Emergency Department (ED) pressures and provide alternative accessible care for the community.

The CCFCC has expanded to include assessment, testing and treatment for patients with symptoms of COVID, cold and flu, including:

- Fever or chills
- Cough (not related to other causes such as allergies)
- Difficulty breathing
- Muscle aches or joint pain
- · Decreased or loss of taste or smell
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (such as vomiting or diarrhea)
- Runny nose or nasal congestion
- Abdominal pain (not related to other causes)
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- Sore throat
- Pink eye (not related to other causes)

Consider making an appointment with the CCFCC if:

- You do not have a primary care provider
- Your symptoms are getting worse and are not improving, and you feel you need medical care
- You have been told by a health professional to go to the CCFCC
- You are at high risk of getting very sick from COVID-19 and you qualify for testing and treatment

The services provided at the clinic are available to adults only at this time and include; COVID-19 assessment and PCR testing; cold and flu assessment; and medical guidance by a health care team which could include triaging or next steps to patient care, including treatment. This clinic will expand to serve paediatric patients in the near future and we will share details when they become available.

"We are well equipped to expand the services offered at the assessment centre and help relieve some of the pressures currently in our adult EDs," said Deborah Wiseman, President of Victoria Hospital. "We welcome the government's approach to expanding services at all assessment centres across the province in an effort to support London area families this season, and alleviate the pressures felt by our ED teams."

When possible, your primary care provider (family doctor or nurse practitioner) should be the first option when seeking medical care. If you are connecting with your primary care provider by phone or video, they may recommend you visit the COVID, Cold and Flu Care Clinic (CCFCC) for testing, assessment, and/or treatment.

Anyone experiencing a medical emergency, should go to the nearest ED or call 911.

Located at Victoria Hospital, 800 Commissioners Rd, E, in Building 24 the clinic is open seven days a week, 9:20 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., and appointments must be made in advance online or by calling 519-685-8500 ext. 75503.
