

## Riverforks Community Update - January 2016

Dear Riverforks Community Member,

This past November, LHSC was pleased to host an open house at 54 Riverview Avenue for neighbours in the Riverforks community so they could tour through the renovated space that will become the home of LHSC's Adult Eating Disorders Service and <u>CMHA-Middlesex</u> youth transitional apartments. At this point, the required capital funding for moving LHSC's PEPP (Prevention & Early Intervention in Psychosis Program) to the facility has yet to be identified and there are some clinical practice logistics to be considered.

LHSC is set to begin the final steps to ready the Riverview Ave site for programs and this includes the installation of fibre optic cable to connect the facility to LHSC's information technology systems. Following a competitive bidding process, Rogers was the successful proponent, and they will be at the site periodically over the next month to install cable. Once this installation is complete, the program moves will begin in phases. The first move will be the transition apartments with CMHA-Middlesex expected to begin moving furniture into the building mid-February, and residents moving in as early as March 1.
