		-high fall risks are often caused by medications, not calling staff for assistance, weakness and unsteady gait	
		-November is Falls Prevention month, Fred suggested having an interview with Cathy to go into the newsletter in November	
		-council members suggested information on past falls, and information that identifies patient as a high	

		fall risk should be visible in chart, as well as posted in every patient room	
		-council members also suggested the white boards in patient rooms should be used more regularly to communicate information like high fall risks
