1.1	Welcome, Approval of Minutes	-September 8 minutes approval and Oct 6 notes approval -Welcome guest Sandee Matthews from Baxter -welcome to new advisor Deb Beaupre	
2.1	Baxter Patient Education Tool	-Sandee Matthews and Cecelia Li from Baxter Canada presented "Dialysis Snap Shot" a patient education tool -the tool educates and guides patients and families through the dialysis treatment decision process and can be accessed by anyone for free over the internet	www.kidneycampus.ca
3.1	Patient Resource Task Group	-the group has finalized the proposal and has submitted to Janice -awaiting estimates from outside company regarding the creation of a display rack which will hold brochures, a suggestion box, business cards, etc.	
3.2	Patient Feedback Task Group Report Satellite Visits	-Hanover satellite visit was completed on Oct. 28. George, Don and Angela attended -heard a lot about transportation and lack of availability or funding for transportation in their own community -patients felt is was not their choice that certain health care options were not available in their own community, so they should be compensated for their travel -Chatham visit planned for December 1 st , George, Angela, Fred, Bob and Don will attend	-satellite visit report attached

3.3	Patient Transportation Task Group	George mentioned that one of the patients did not give feedback, even though she was given the opportunity due to a possible fear of reprisal, Dr Rehman suggestion having patients fill out confidential feedback forms -George mentioned that in a very small dialysis unit some patients may fear giving honest feedback because even though it might be anonymous, the patient may still be more likely to be identified -the ORN is looking at provincial wide validated tools for collecting feedback from patients and families -Patient Experience is looking at "Just In Time" surveys, and different vendors for creating a patient feedback form -rather than the Renal program creating a feedback tool, we want a validated, tested tool, so waiting to see if LHSC or the ORN comes up with one first -Janice suggested that once all of the satellite visits are completed that the findings are summarized into common themes so we can get an idea of the big picture and recommendations for improvement -the survey is near completion and once done Angela will take it out to the dialysis units -Young will talk to all of the social workers and get lists of paratransit users in the 3 dialysis units -the plan is to send a letter to the managers of the service outlining our issues -George suggested that the transport task group could also look at the costs that patients are incurring for travel to dialysis when they live out of town, and the waiting list time for satellite units

4.8	Privacy rules surrounding sharing when a patient passes away	-Deb contacted the privacy office about confidentiality rules when a patient passes away -as long as the person asking can mention the deceased by name, it is legal for the hospital employee to share that the patient has passed away or that the patient is in the hospital, but the asker must know the person well enough to ask for them by their name -if the patient has requested to be anonymous no information can be shared -Deb will send this information out to all staff members within the renal program
