Summary of Changes to the CMOH Directive for Hospitals

The Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) issued a Directive for Hospitals to provide instructions to hospitals concerning control measures related to Ebola virus disease (EVD).

A revised version of the Directive was issued on January 14, 2015. The major changes to the Directive include:

- outlining the ministry's <u>three-tier hospital framework for EVD</u>, including clarifying roles & responsibilities and appropriate control measures for screening, testing and treatment hospitals
- describing the <u>public health monitoring process</u> that has been established for travellers from EVD-affected countries/areas in West Africa
- clarifying the role of the public health unit and Public Health Ontario
 Laboratories to support hospitals in determining if EVD testing is required for a patient that has failed the active screening process
- outlining the process that testing and treatment hospitals must use to initiate testing for EVD through the Public Health Ontario Laboratories
- describing the separation and layout that hospitals must establish to appropriately delineate clean (cold zone), potentially contaminated (warm zone) and contaminated areas (hot zone)
- outlining best practices for the cleaning and disinfecting of noncritical equipment, as well as the reprocessing of semi-critical and critical equipment
- instructing hospitals on the awareness and training requirements for EVD
