What has changed?

- No mandatory patch point for the administration of naloxone to patients ≥ 18 years of age
- Up to three doses of naloxone with dosing interval of 10 minutes (SC, IM, IN) or immediately (IV)

Version 4.3 Update (In force date: July 17, 2017)

Updates the "Age" Condition for naloxone from >18 years to >12 years (PCP/ACP)

Why has it changed?

- Increase in opioid overdoses and deaths across Canada
- Potency of opioids being used recreationally has increased

How does it affect paramedic practice?

- Paramedic clinical judgment replaces the mandatory patch for patients ≥ 18 years of age.
- Medical directive is the same for PCP and ACP.
- In force date: December 23, 2016.
