What has changed?

 A new medical directive has been added to the ALS PCS v4.0: Suspected Adrenal Crisis Medical Directive (for both PCPs and ACPs).

Why has it changed?

- There appears to be an increase in the prevalence of patients with adrenal crisis requiring assistance to administer medication.
- Clarity and direction was sought for paramedics faced with patients who require the administration
 of hydrocortisone but who are not able to self-administer or have a family member administer the
 medication.

How does it affect paramedic practice?

 Paramedics are now better able to provide appropriate emergency care for patients suffering from suspected adrenal crisis
