A Nurse, Social worker and a Dietician are available to you. If you feel the need for either of these services please notify your CA or physician and they will arrange for them to see you here or to call you at home.

Self- Referral OB Clinic

IF you don't have a family doctor to contact and you are a patient of the OB self-referral clinic, you may call to speak with a team member at 519-685-8500 ext. 55297 if you have any concerns.

What to expect during your visit

There are nine pods in our new area each with a different physician. A volunteer and/or signs will help you if you don't know what pod your doctor is working in.

For every appointment, please register at the Patient Registration Office. You will need to show your health card to the receptionist.

On your first visit, you will be asked to complete a medical questionnaire.

.Please fill this out while you are waiting. A Clinic Assistant (CA) can help if needed.

You will be asked to wait in the waiting room. One of our CA's will call you into the clinic Pod..

There are many physicians working in our clinic at one time. If your wait has been exceptionally long please check with the CA or registration for an update.

What happens in the clinic?

The CA will bring you to our interview room. You will take your weight and put your urine sample on the counter. Please put your name on the cup.

One of our CA's will record your weight, blood pressure and urine test results.

You will then go to an examination room to see the doctor or be asked to wait in the waiting area.

You may ask to speak to a Nurse or Social Worker at any time if you have questions or concerns.

Our doctors are Obstetricians and Gynecologists. They are very busy so your wait may be long. Bring a drink and snack if you wish. Please try not to book other appointments on the same day.

LHSC is a teaching hospital so please be prepared to see nursing and medical students or residents as well as your physician.

How many appointments will I need?

We will see you every 4 weeks until you are 28 weeks, then every 2 weeks and after 36 weeks we will see you weekly until you deliver your baby.

Please make a follow-up appointment 6 weeks after you have your baby with either your Obstetrician or family doctor.

Our Doctors deliver their own patient's babies if possible. However, they have a call schedule. You may be cared for by one of our other Obstetricians. She/he will have access to all of your patient information to provide you and your baby with the best quality patient care.

Please wash your hands upon entering and leaving the clinic.



LHSC provides a family centred care centre: however, as space is limited we ask that you limit the number of people you bring with you to your appointment.

Week 18 to 20	Obstetrical ultrasound

Week 18 to 22	1st fetal movement felt
Week 24 to 28	Gestational diabetes & blood work (for some patients)
Week 28 to 30	Start visits every two weeks
	Rh Immune globulin injection (Rh negative patients)
Week 36	Group B Streptococcus vaginal swab
	Start weekly visits
Week 40	Due date /
Week 41 to 42	Consider induction of labour if over due
